#### MELBOURNE NOTES

- Delmon Young's power was on full display Saturday night, as the former Major Leaguer homered twice, a grand slam in the first inning and a solo shot in the second. His three home runs and eight runs batted in are both tops in the ABL.
- Yuma Mune has continued to make his presence known in the ABL, as he recorded his third straight multi-hit game in as many games this season, notching three base knocks Saturday, including a second inning home run. His seven hits league the lead the ABL.
- For the third straight night, at least six Aces reached base on a hit. Mune, Young and Hayato Nishiura each have hits in all three games, whole Kodai Sano recorded his second straight two-hit game.
- Three Aces hitters fetched their first base hits of the season: Chris Burke pinch hit for Young in the 8th and singled, Allan de San Miguel snapped an 0-11 stretch to open the season with a single in the 9th and Ryan Dale went 3-5 in his first game of the season.
- From the last out of the third inning to the first out of the ninth, Melbourne pitching retired Canberra hitters in order- 17 in a row between starter Wes Helsabeck, Peter Moylan, Sam Street and Scott Shuman.

### **CANBERRA NOTES**

- Calvary starter **Dushan Ruzic** struggled against his former team, unable to make it out of the third inning after allowing six runs on six hits and five walks in 2.2 innings.
- Canberra's only offensive success came in the first inning when three of the first four batters reached base with a hit.
- Five different Cavalry batters recorded a hit, though none had more than one.
- The bottom of Canberra's lineup (7-9 hitters) combined to go 1-10 with six strikeouts after going 5-11 with four runs scored on Thursday and 5-11 with four runs scored and five driven in Friday.
- Despite being retired in order in five consecutive innings (4th-8th), the Cavalry managed to leave eight runners on base- two in the first, one in the second, two in the third and three in the ninth, stranding the bases loaded to end the game.
